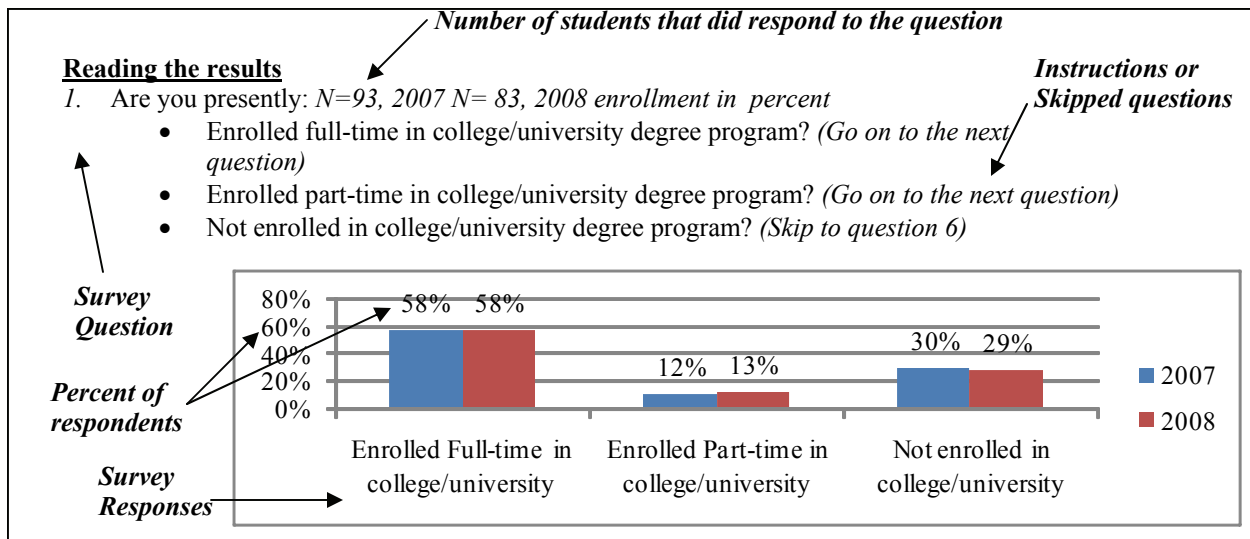


In 2006, a team of researchers at Indiana University Purdue University at Indianapolis (IUPUI) worked with the IACTED to develop a longitudinal study of select CTE program graduates. The research team used a survey questionnaire created by the members of IACTED. The survey questions were developed to focus on education, employment, and personal plans. The survey consisted of 26 questions, which would be administered once a year for five years. The study would provide researchers with data which could be used to track graduates of CTE programs. The study methodology consisted of researchers travelling to six randomly assigned CTE schools within Indiana and obtaining contact information and consent forms from program graduates. The sample selected for the study was stratified to cover specific demographics such as: geographic location, program participation, gender, and ethnicity.

The 2007 study began in April with 398 study participants. Several strategies were developed to help encourage participation in the study. The research team implemented the www.CTEstudy.com website as a way for participants to get information, submit surveys, and change contact information. The survey methods are listed below.

Each year, the research team sends out a personalized email and letter informing the participant of the study, and of the different ways they can submit their responses. The team makes every attempt to contact each person that was initially part of the study via phone, email, letter, and the internet. In 2007 and 2008, participants of the study were contacted and the total sample sizes were n=101 for 2007 and n=83 for 2008. Each year the survey opens in summer and closes before the end of the year. In that time, the team sends emails, letters, post cards, and makes 2 phone calls to each participant in the study.

The focus of this report is to present the results of the survey, as each year a new report is created to update the public and educators as to the outcomes of CTE education in Indiana. The survey instrument used for the study was designed with input from the IACTED members and the research team of Charlie Feldhaus, Stephen Hundley and Nathan Mott, all faculty members at IUPUI. The year two report highlights changes in 2007 to 2008 using the percentage of each study year for each categorized response. The survey requested the respondents to only answer relevant questions, so some questions are skipped or have lower response rates because of the study design. Each survey question is part of the report and provides information similar to the figure below.



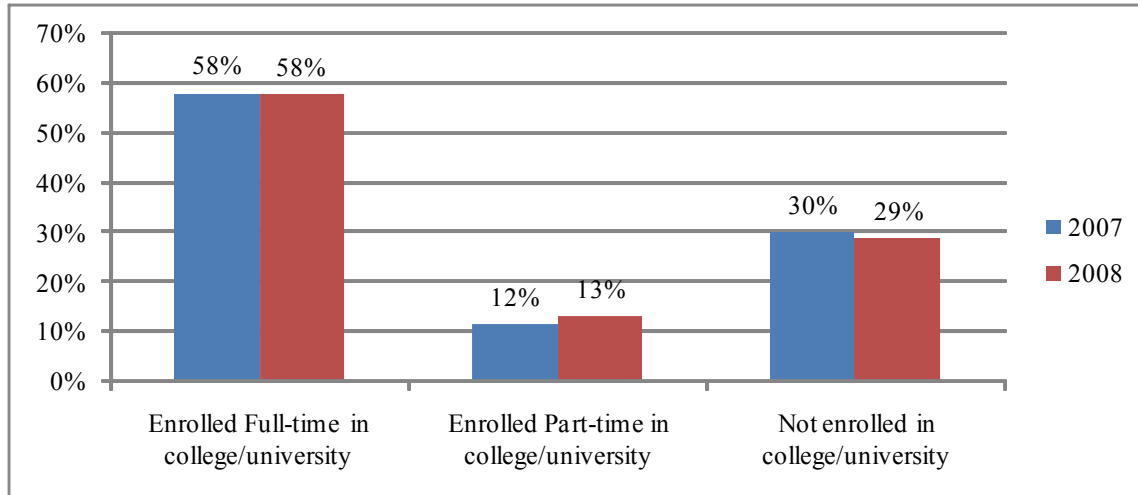

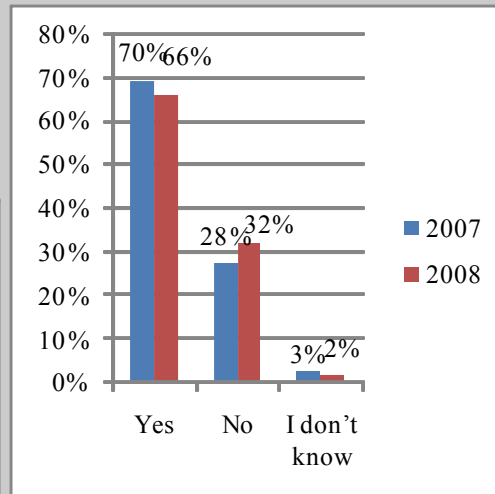
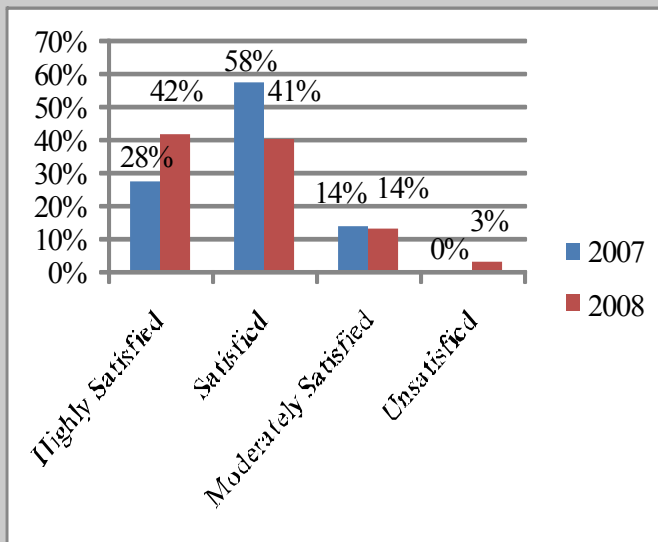

2. Are you participating in a college/university degree program related to Career/Technical Education experiences in which you participated in high school?

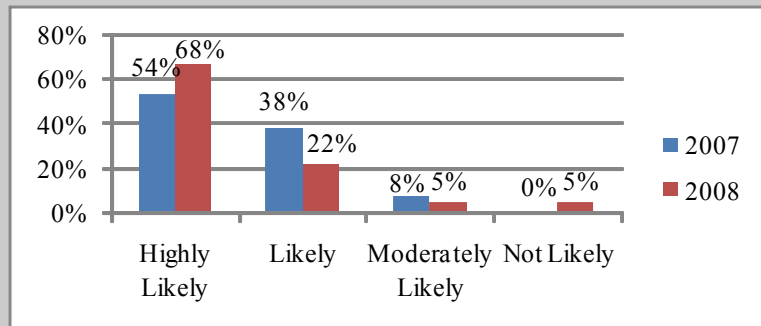


3. How satisfied are you with your present college/university degree program?

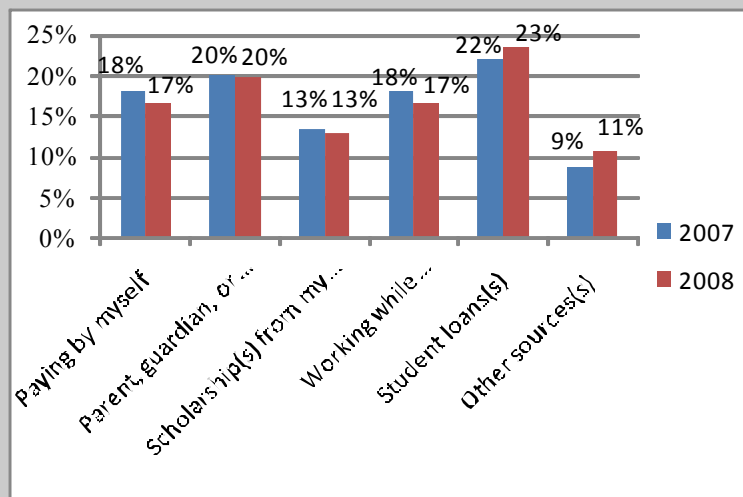

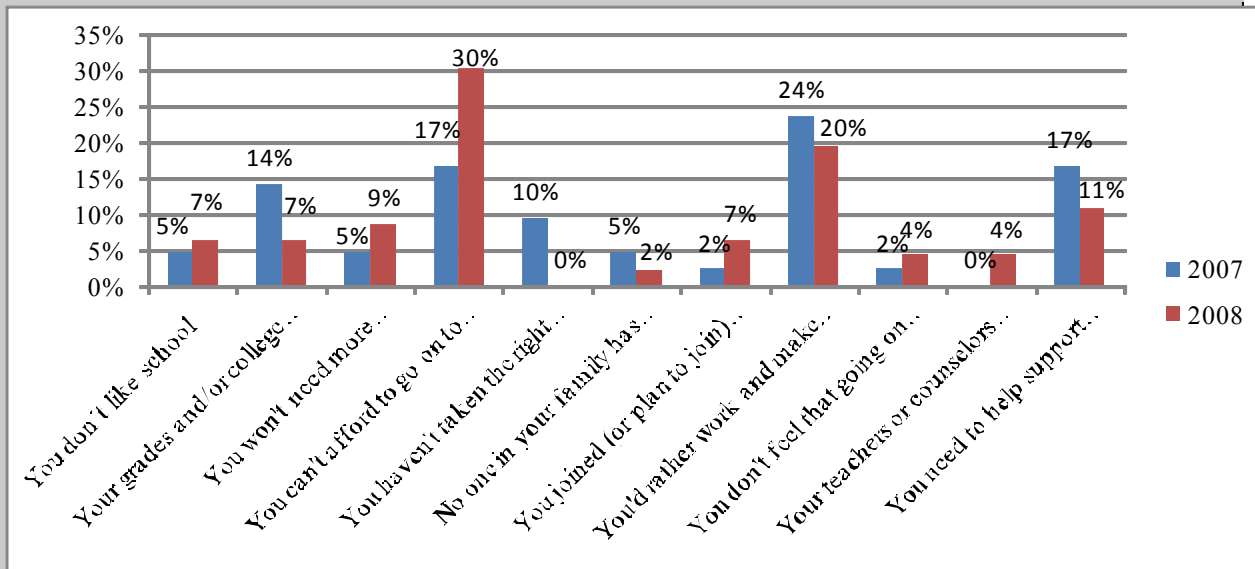

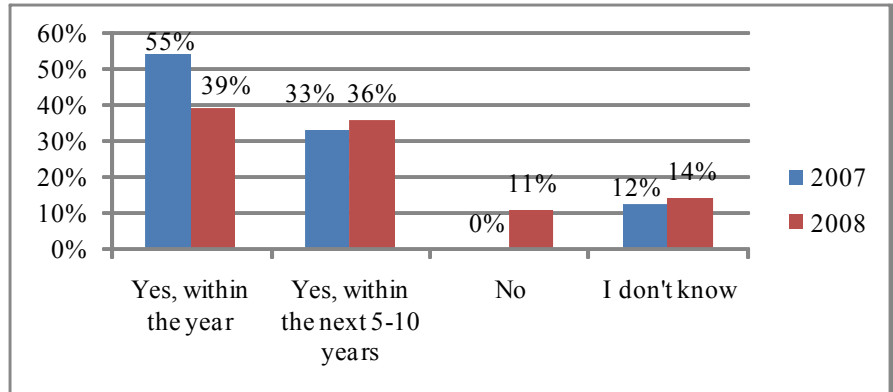

7. Do you plan to continue your education at some time in the future? $N=33$, 2007 $N= 28$, 2008

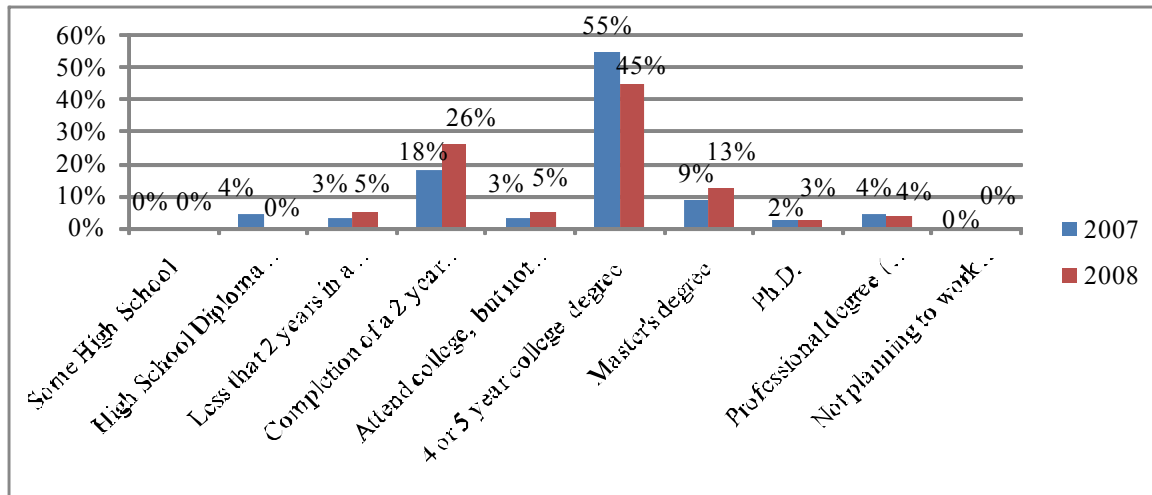

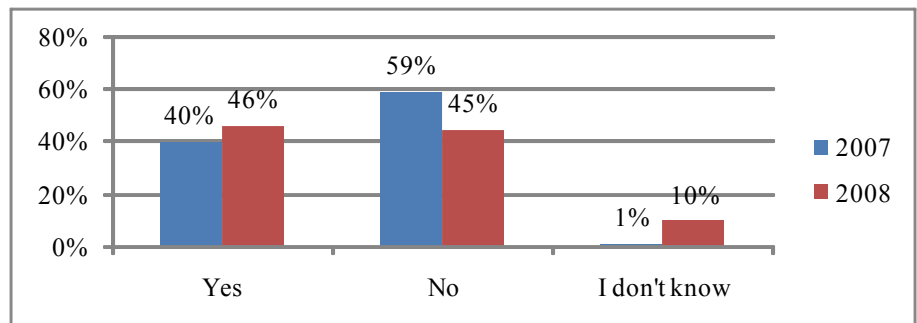


8. How much education do you think you need to get the job you expect to have or plan to have when you are 30 years old? $N=101-12$ (NR)

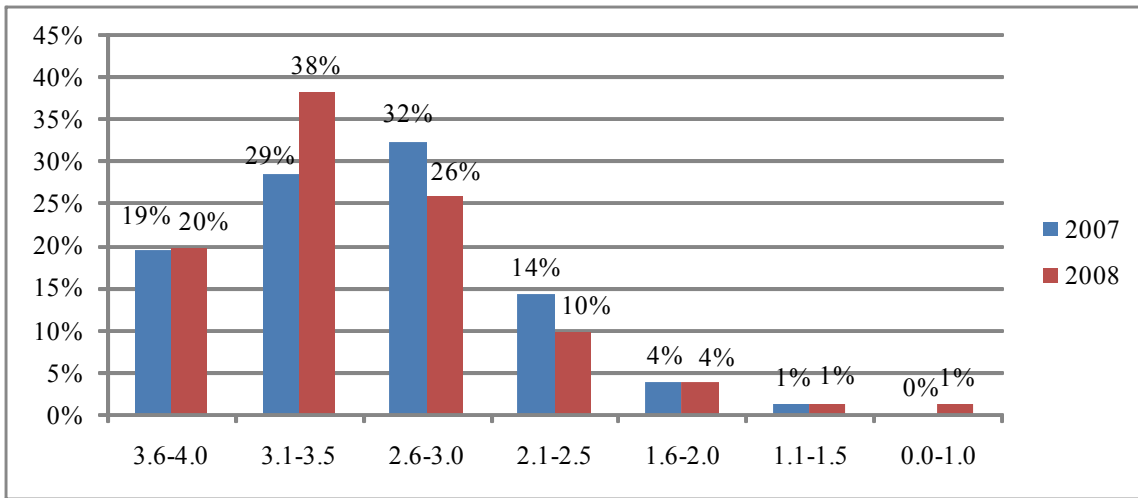

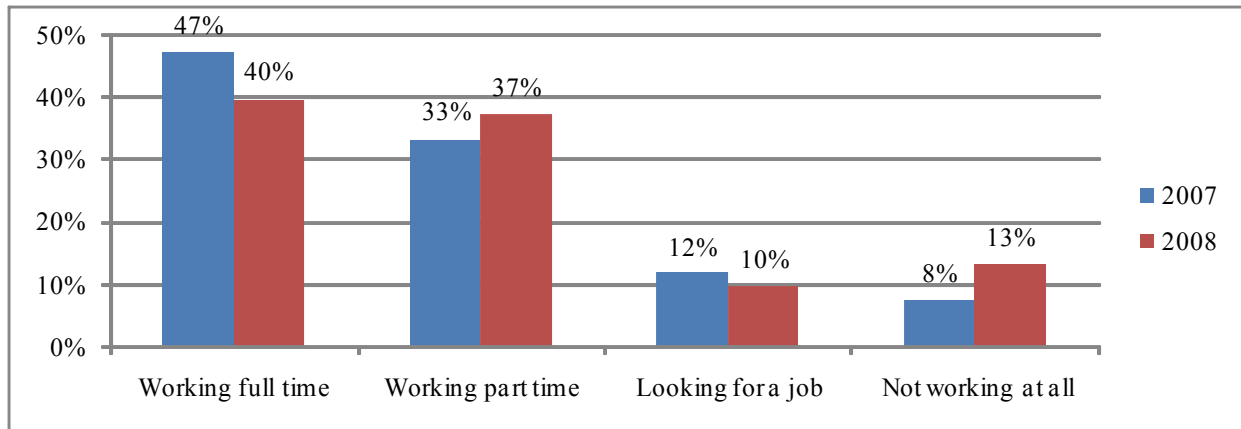

“The training I received at C-9 helped jumpstart my career as an I professional. Also, I always highly recommend tech schools to young people that I meet.” 2008

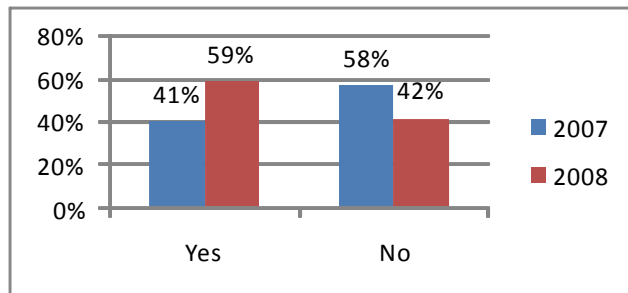
“I really enjoyed my experience at Prosser, and it really helped me prepare myself for the journey on continuing my education.” 2008

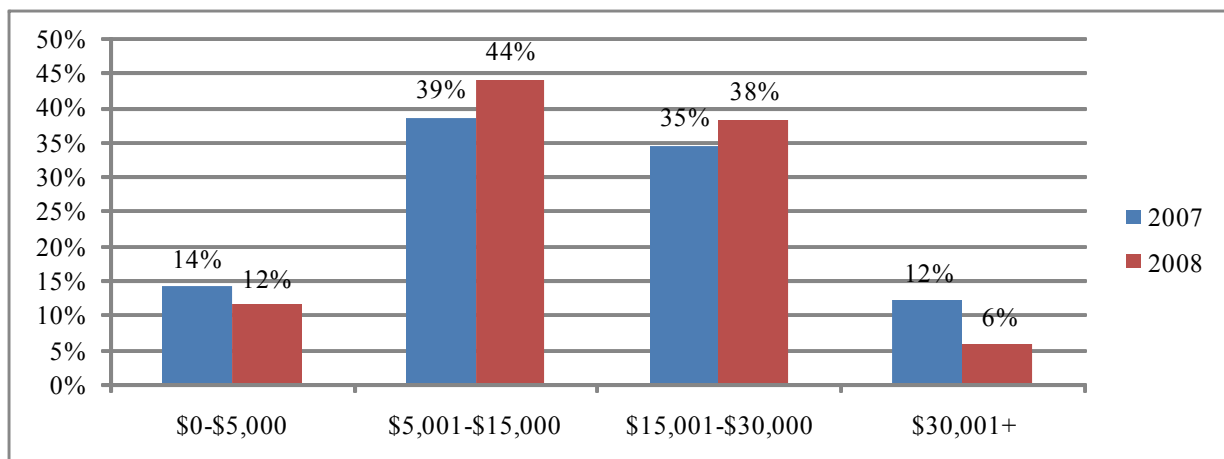


Working full or part time *N=81, 2007 N= 64, 2008*

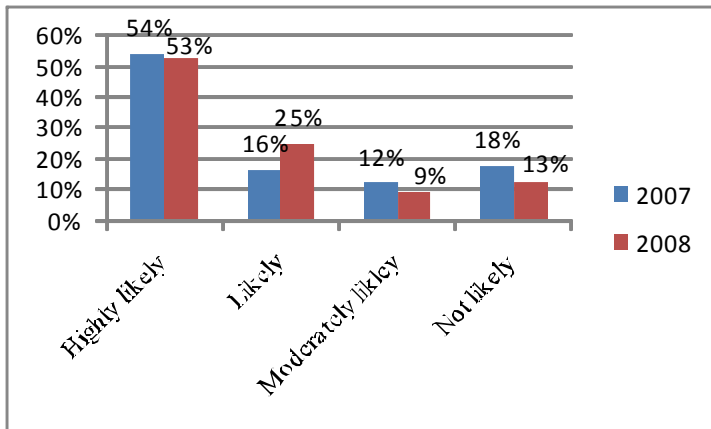
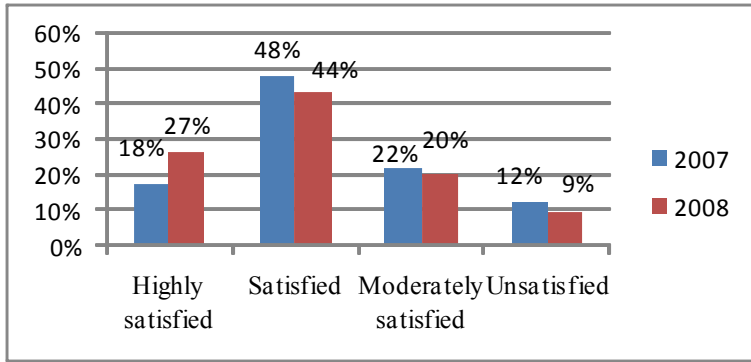
13. Are you employed in a job related to Career/Technical Education experiences in which you participated in high school?



14. In thousands (e.g. \$25,000), what is the approximate annual salary for your present job? *N=49, 2007 N= 52, 2008*



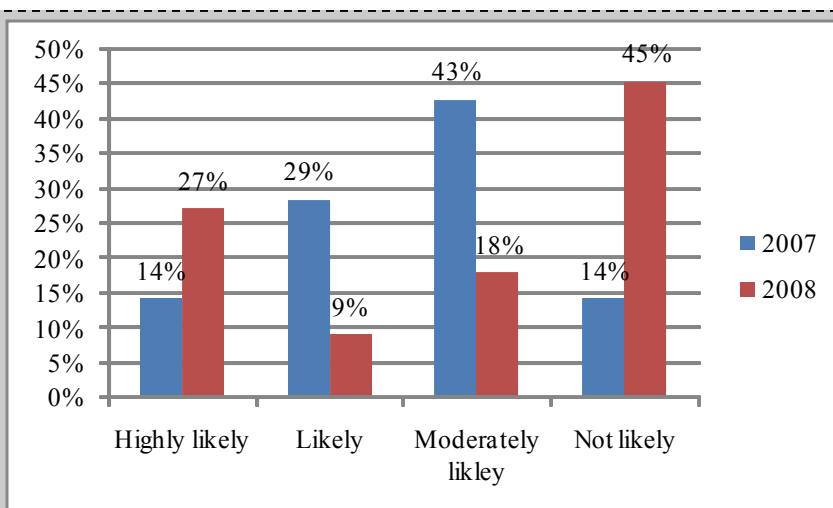
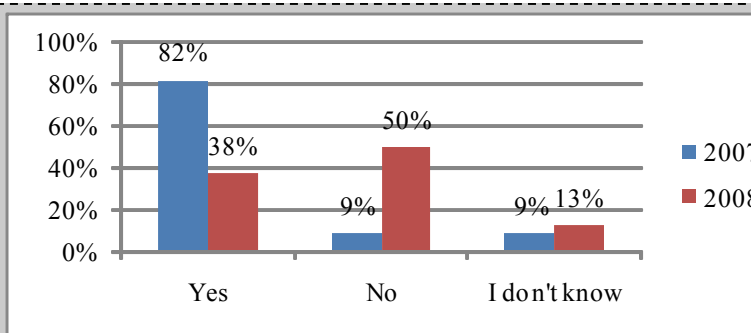
15. How satisfied are you with your present job? $N=73$, 2007 $N=64$, 2008

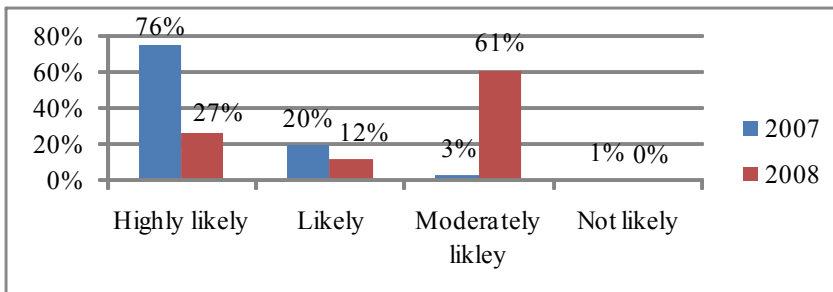
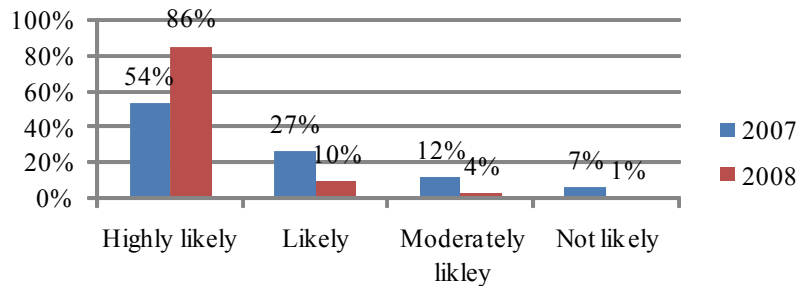
17. If looking for a job, do you anticipate finding employment related to Career/Technical Education experiences in which you participated in high school?

“I have known my career path for years, and being able to become certified through high school was like a dream come true. I love what I do and encourage anyone who is interested to do the same.” 2008

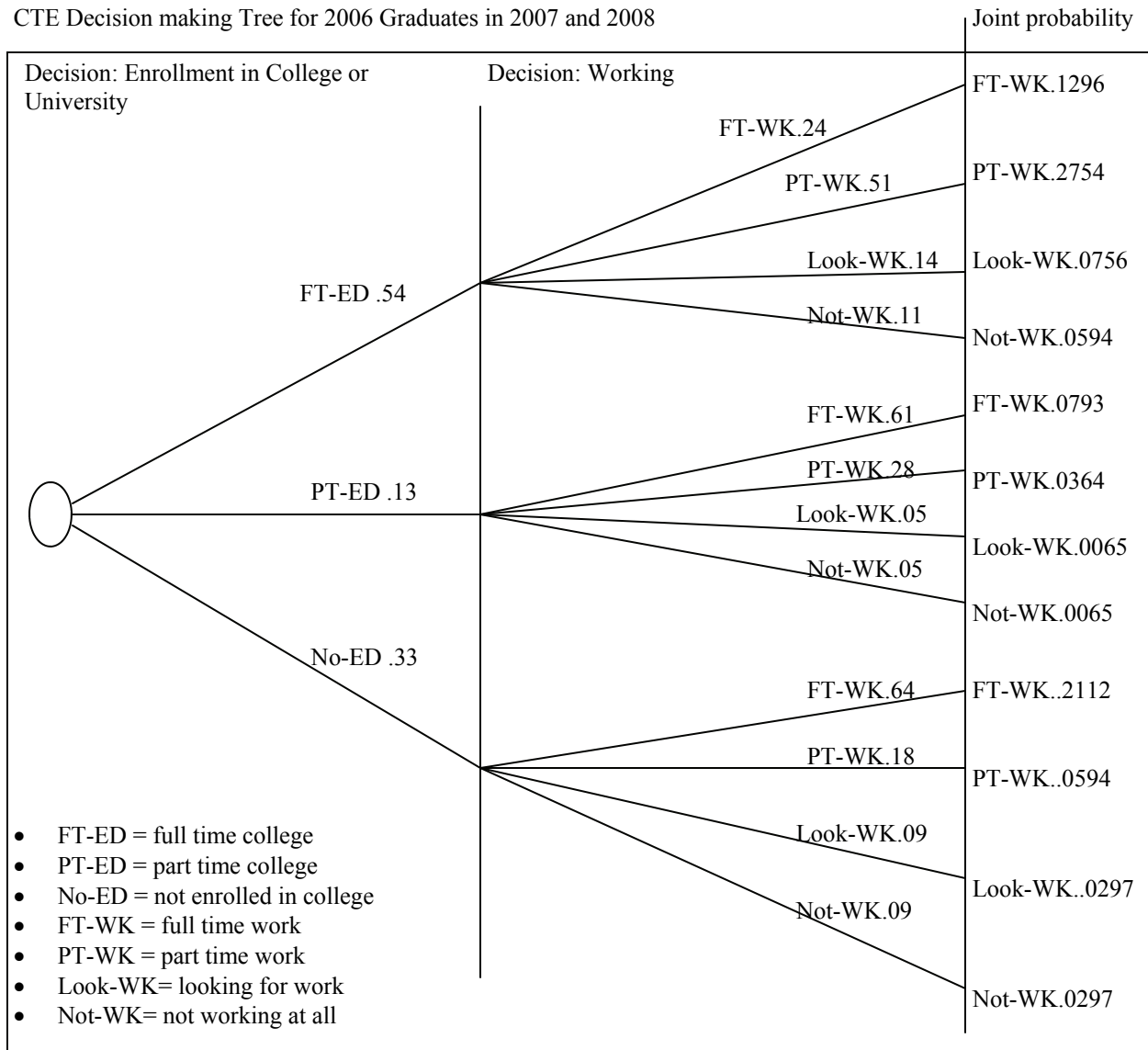

CTE Decision making Tree for 2006 Graduates in 2007 and 2008



CTE students make two major decisions after graduation, resulting in several outcomes. The probability of each response was calculated to provide information about the class of 2006 in the last two years. The calculation was made using unique responses to the study provided in 2007 and 2008 n=134. Based on survey data, 54% of the graduates of 2006 in selected programs are pursuing a college or university program. Of the full time students, only 5.9 % are looking or not employed. There are 33% who report not participating in college or university. However, 64% not in school are working full time. In fact, only 5.9% report to be not in school and not working.
